The Ministry of Foreign Affairs and International Trade of Grenada presents its compliments to the Embassy of the People's Republic of China in Grenada and has the honour to refer to Note No. 16-2005 regarding the appointment of an honorary consul of Grenada in Macao, Special Administrative Region.

The Ministry has the further honour to confirm the following on behalf of the Government of Grenada:

The Government of Grenada and the Government of the People's Republic of China Desirous of developing the friendly relations between the two countries, with regard to the appointment of an Honorary Consul in Macao by the Government of Grenada, and

Through friendly consultations,
Have agreed as follows:

1. The Government of the People's Republic of China agrees to the appointment of an honorary consul in Macao by the Government of Grenada, whose consular district shall cover the Macao Special Administrative Region (MSAR)
2. The Honorary Consul of Grenada in Macao shall exercise his/her consular functions within the scope as defined in the Vienna Convention on Consular Relations done on 24 April 1963, the relevant laws and regulations of the People's Republic of China and the laws of MSAR.

3. the Government of the People's Republic of China will, in accordance with the Vienna Convention on Consular Relations and the relevant laws and regulations of the People's Republic of China, accord necessary assistance and facilities for the performance of the functions of the Honorary Consul of Grenada in Macao.
4. The Honorary Consul of Grenada in Macao must be a permanent resident of MSAR
5. Grenada shall not maintain the honorary consular post upon its establishment of a career consular post in Macao
6. The two sides shall properly handle consular issues between the two countries in the spirit of friendly consultations, and in accordance with The Vienna Convention on Consular Relations and international practice

If the Embassy of the People's Republic of China in Grenada confirms, on behalf of the Government of the People's Republic of China, the foregoing points in a note of reply, this note and the Embassy's Note of reply shall constitute an agreement between the two Governments, which shall come into force as from the date of the note of reply.

The Ministry of Foreign Affairs and International Trade of Grenada avails itself of this opportunity to renew to the Embassy of the People's Republic of China in Grenada the assurances of its highest consideration.
